


Riding the Waves

2019 was a year of growth and a model for the kind of impact the CSC could have on our community. Through partnerships, program participants, and events, 2019 saw more people on the Lake than ever before.

2020 was a dynamic year for the CSC. During the pandemic, we not only ran our summer camps at 90% capacity but we also became a certified childcare program for families to fill a community need we identified early on.

2021 was a transformational year. We started our Sailing Diversity Access Initiative to eliminate cultural, racial, and ethnic boundaries in the sport of sailing. The program provides campers aged 11-15 who identify as Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) a 100% fully paid and supported summer camp experience for up to 4 years.




Charting the Course

As sailors at heart, we plot the course for our annual work. For the Community Sailing Center, setting goals that we endeavor to meet and exceed each year is an important part of who we are. From rentals and Floating Classrooms to camps and adult courses, we measure our community impact and challenge ourselves to meet these milestones.

Recognizing Impact



Diversity Access Initiative

Last year, participation in our award-winning Diversity Access Initiative increased to 29 sailors, including 17 new enrollees and 12 returning campers. This represents a 70% increase in our enrollees and a 70% retention rate.


